The NBA playoffs have begun. The Golden State Warriors are vying for their second NBA Championship in a row. And when I think of basketball I think of..... Church! How about you?

When I entered in to "Probationary Ministry" for the United Methodist Church in 1990, I was ordained in the gym under the basket at Springfield College in Springfield, Massachusetts. Springfield College is the birthplace of basketball. As Bishop Skeete prayed for the power of The Holy Spirit to work in us and through us, I'm sure that the



spirit of James Naismith was praying right along with the Bishop. Naismith, who was REV MARK J. BRADY an ordained minister in the Presbyterian Church, was convinced that he could better exemplify the Christian life through sports than in the pulpit, he moved to Springfield, Mass., to serve as a physical-education instructor at the Young Men's Christian Association's International Training School for Christian Workers (now Springfield College). Naismith's vision? "To win men for the Master through the gym."

James Naismith believed that with good coaching basketball could produce the following results: "initiative, agility, accuracy, alertness, co-operation, skill, reflex judgment, speed, self-confidence, self-sacrifice, selfcontrol, and sportsmanship." He saw self-sacrifice as "a willingness to place the good of the team above one's personal ambitions," saying, "There is no place in basketball for the egotist." Sportsmanship was described by Naismith as "playing the game vigorously, observing the rules definitely, accepting defeat gracefully, and winning courteously." In short, basketball meant playing by the Golden Rule and loving your neighbor.

Today that Spirit of bringing "Others to the Master through the Gym" (OMG) is being carried forward by The Golden State Warriors and NBA League MVP- Stephen Curry. In a recent interview Curry reflected on his faith saying, "Looking back, my childhood was filled with the Lord's presence. My parents raised us to believe in God, and we were at church every Sunday for services... God's given me talents to play basketball for a living, but I still have to work hard to improve every day. I know that in the grand scheme of things, this is just a game that can be taken from me at any moment. But I love that basketball gives me the opportunities to do good things for people and to point them towards the Man who died for our sins on the cross. I know I have a place in heaven waiting for me because of Him, and that's something no earthly prize or trophy could ever top."

In spite of all the attention, Curry retains a sense of humility and balance rooted in one of his favorite Bible verses, Philippians 4:13: "I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me." In an article he wrote that was posted on Breaking Christian News he says, "... I am just trying to use this stage to share how God has been a blessing to my life and how He can be the same in everyone else's... There's more to me than just this jersey I wear, and that's Christ living inside of me." He summed up his life in basketball and his life of faith this way, "I love to play the game, and I love when good things happen," he said. "But when I get home, it's about my family and just enjoying the blessings in my life without letting [basketball] define my personality or my character." The time with my wife is huge so we can continue to grow and not be complacent with where we are in our walk with Christ. Obviously, we can all be better at that."




Dear friends of Union Church,

Streams of Living Water

Some time ago, a Christian friend of mine suffered a sudden and temporarily life-threatening stroke. It felled him immediately. If you could choose a place for such a personal catastrophe you would choose, as my friend did, to have it right outside a fire station. Medics were at his side immediately and shipped him off to the hospital. A hard decision then had to be made. Should the trauma staff administer a powerful drug that has a fifty percent chance of clearing the blood clot at the base of his brain or a similar chance that it could cause death or life in a vegetable state? The momentous decision was made with fervent prayer from friends in an email prayer chain and, through God's Grace, he pulled through with no long term ill effects.

During his recovery in the hospital he asked his wife why all that water was pouring on his head. She said that there was no water; he said he could hear and feel it. It was like sitting under a 500' water fall – total inundation. At that moment he knew that he was going to be just fine.

Some years later, I was roaming around an old deserted castle tower in France where I heard the sound of water flowing. I peered over the side of a deep gully and could hear the running water clearly but could not see it – although it was very near. At that moment, my friend's story came back to me as also did the words of that old hymn, The King of Love my Shepherd is, and the words about 'streams of living water that flow.' I sat down on a rock and pondered those words and thought about God's healing power that can flow in us and through us just like water. You may not see it, but you may feel it or hear it pouring over your body in time of need and by God's grace. Some of you may have been there – I certainly have.

Thank you God for restoring us to health through your grace and through our own prayers and through the prayers of those who love us, open up those flood gates and inundate us with those powerful streams of living water that flow through our bodies and souls. Amen

Requirements to Apply for a Scholarship:

A current high school senior in one of the two groups who meets the following requirements:

- GPA of 3.0 or higher
- Has received a letter of acceptance from a school of post-secondary education (two- or four-year program).
- Has overcome a significant life obstacle, either physical, social, economic or cultural
- Has served the community through service projects
- Has an academic interest in English and the liberal arts, or Science or Engineering
- Submits at least one letter of recommendation from a teacher, guidance counselor, employer, church, community activity leader, etc.
- Submits an essay of 200 300 words describing the challenge they have overcome
- Is available to interview with the scholarship committee, either in person or by phone

The scholarship winners will be chosen by the agreement of a committee with a minimum of three members, including at least one member of Joann Minnick's family and at least one representative from Union Church of Cupertino appointed by the Church Board. For more info contact the church office.


